## From Humble Beginnings

It was not long after Richard the Lionheart had granted Norwich its city charter in 1194 that the Dominican Blackfriars arrived in our city and settled in Colegate parish. They would eventually take over the buildings of a minor order of Friars from Marseille. The Crypt Café is situated in one of these original buildings from the 13<sup>th</sup> century, which included the Thomas a Becket Chapel.

## St Andrews Hall

St Andrews Hall is one of the most recognisable sights in Norwich and has been an important part of civic life since it was purchased by the City from Henry V111 in 1538. The City hoped to '*make the churche a fayer and large halle, well pathed, for the mayor and his brethren.... For their common assemblyes...*' Nearly 500 years on, the hall is still used for civic events, the Norfolk and Norwich Festival, the annual Norwich Beer Festival and the graduation ceremonies of the Norwich School of Art and Design.

## The Coffee House

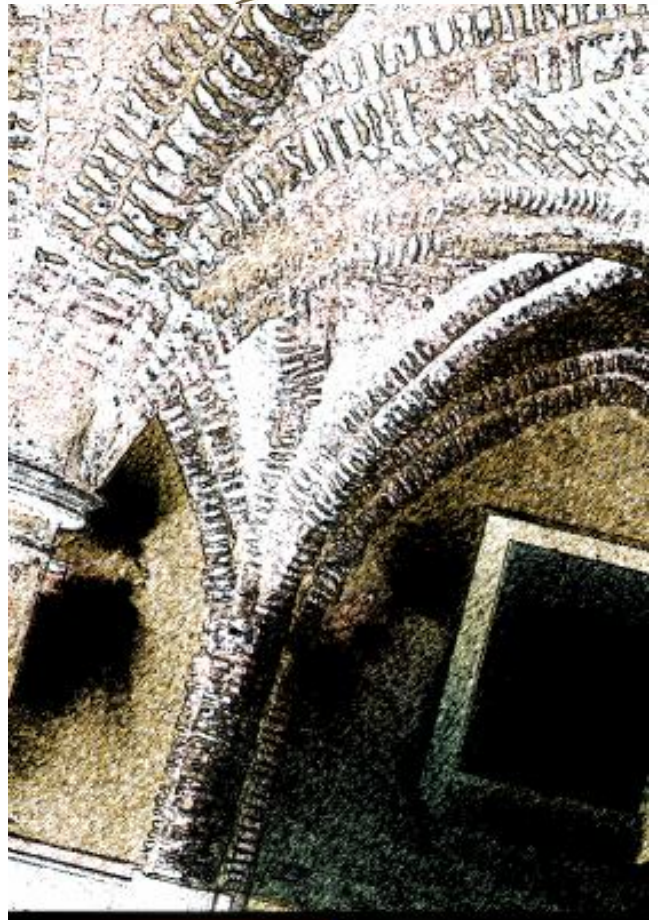
Although Panini weren't on the menu in 1700, coffee certainly was. The City set aside a part of St Andrew's hall to serve as a coffee house. The coffee house was an integral part of social life during the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries and guests would transact business, discuss politics and share literary works in progress. All of which you are welcome to do here!

## Sir Thomas Erpingham

When much of the hall was destroyed by fire in 1413, Sir Thomas Erpingham's family donated large sums of money for the rebuilding of the church. Sir Thomas was knighted by John of Gaunt, served in the teutonic crusades in Lithuania with Henry Bolingbroke and perhaps most famously fought alongside Henry V at Agincourt. It was Sir Thomas who commanded Henry's deadly archers, and gave the signal to fire; recorded by the confused French as "Nestoque!" – "Now Strike!" in Sir Thomas' Norfolk accent. He is buried in Norwich Cathedral where he erected a gate as his personal memorial

## Timeline

- **1226** – Dominican Blackfriars arrive in Norwich and settle north of this site in the parish of Colegate
- **1270-1307** – The Crypt and Thomas a Becket chapel built
- **1307** – Dominican Blackfriars take up residency from the incumbent minor order of Sack Friars from Marseilles.
- **1326** – The construction of the friary church dedicated to St. John the Baptist and the largest of the four city friaries, was begun but not finished until 1470 due to a fire destroying the majority of the building in 1413
- **1538** – At the reformation the City petitioned King Henry V111 to purchase the friary and to *"make the church a fayer and large halle, well pathed, for the mayor and his brethren... for their common assemblies"*
- **1540** – The halls were a Dominican friary for almost three hundred years until the monks fell on hard times and sold the buildings to the City for the princely sum of £81 in June.
- **1544** – The first recorded event to be held at the halls was the Mayor's feast for Henry Fuller.
- **1594** – The Earl of Warwick stabled his horses here when he came to crush Kett's rebellion
- **1671** – Sir Thomas Browne was knighted here by Charles II
- **1695** – In the great re-coinage of 1695, £259,000 in half crowns, shillings and sixpences were minted in a corner of the Cloisters and these bear the letter N under the bust of William II.
- **1712** – The buildings became the City Workhouse until 1859, when a Commercial School was established here which became the City of Norwich School
- **1824** – The Norfolk and Norwich Festival started in these halls and continue to the present day.
- **1909** – The halls has hosted many lavish banquets including one held in the honour of King Edward VII
